Variance Explanations

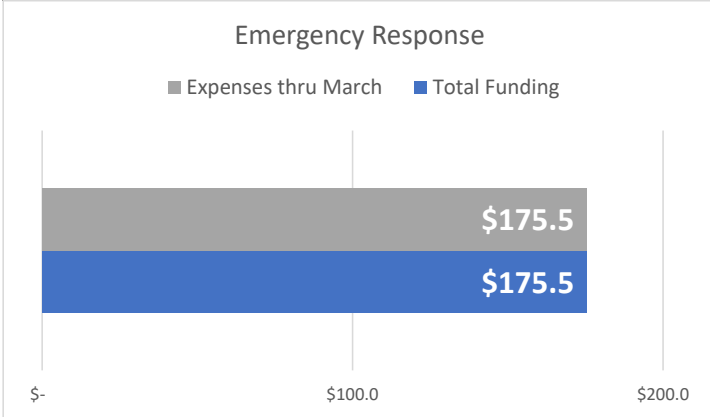
- 1 The favorable variance is due to additional interest earned from January through March 2023.
- 2 Favorable variance is due to Workforce Development programs having fewer participants than projected. A total of 2,405 participants have completed the program and received a job, 5,506 have enrolled, and 101 participants received child care subsidies.
- 3 The Public Safety-Byrne JAG grant ended January 31, 2023 with closeout ending April 2023. Thereafter, the program will be closed.

Spending Plan by Program

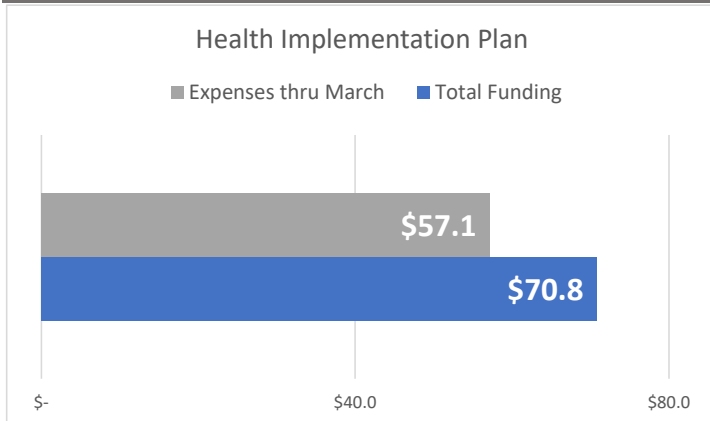

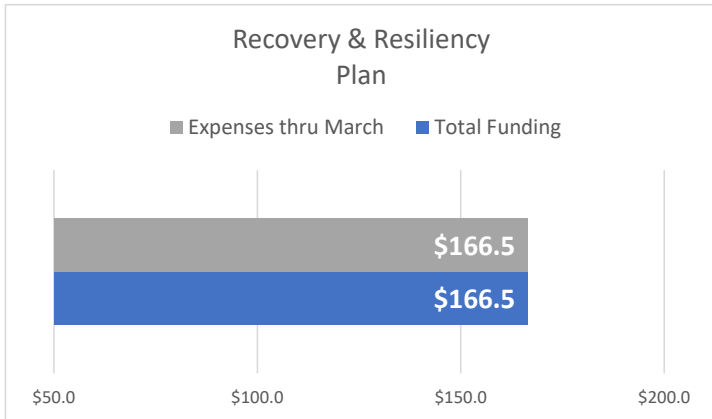

Spending Plan by Program

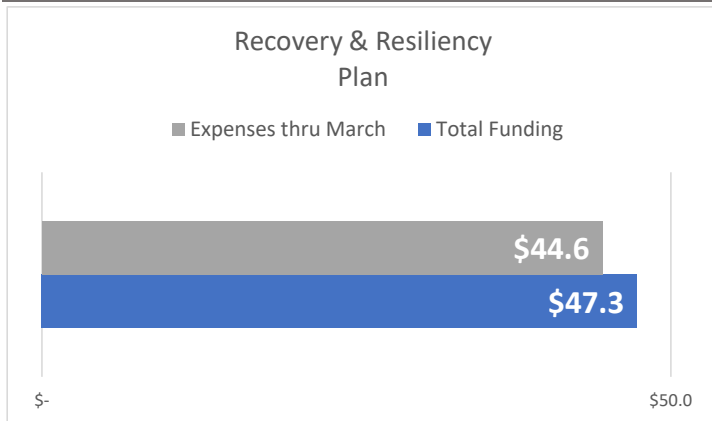

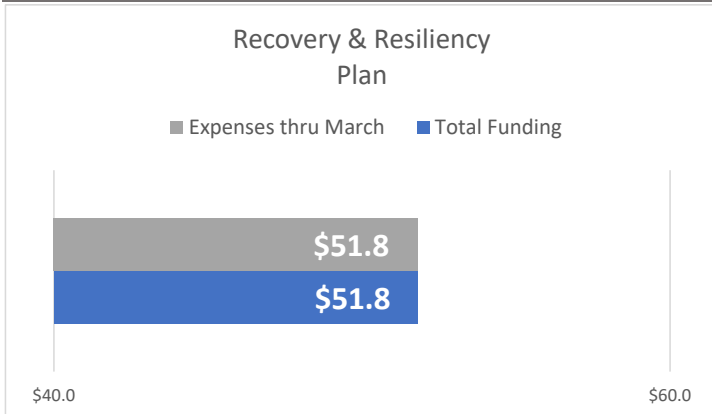

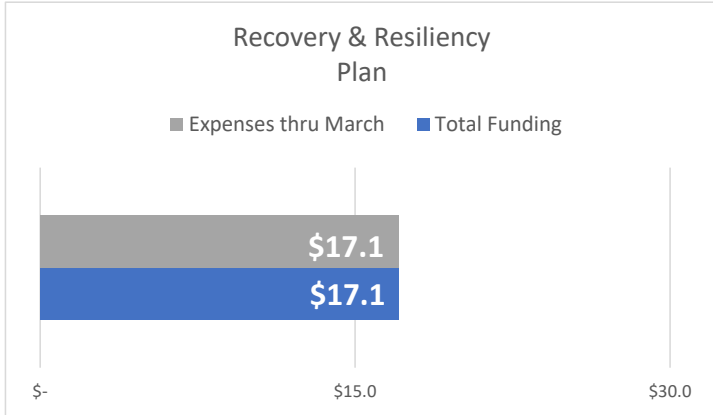

Spending Plan by Program

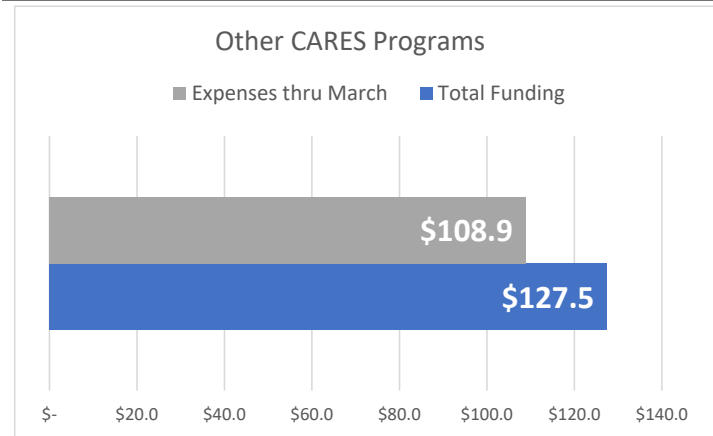

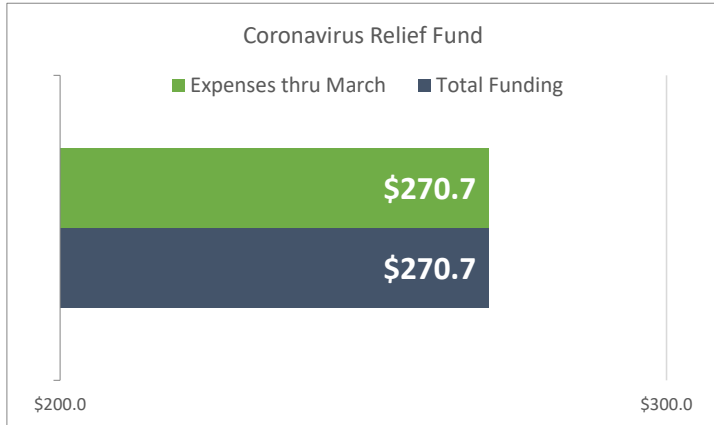

Spending Plans by Funding Source

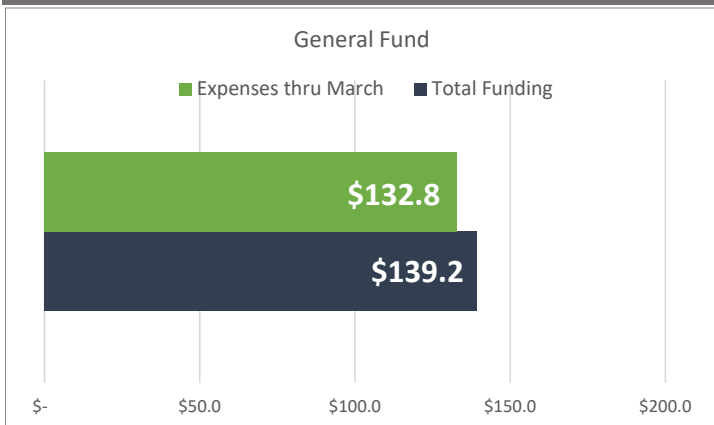

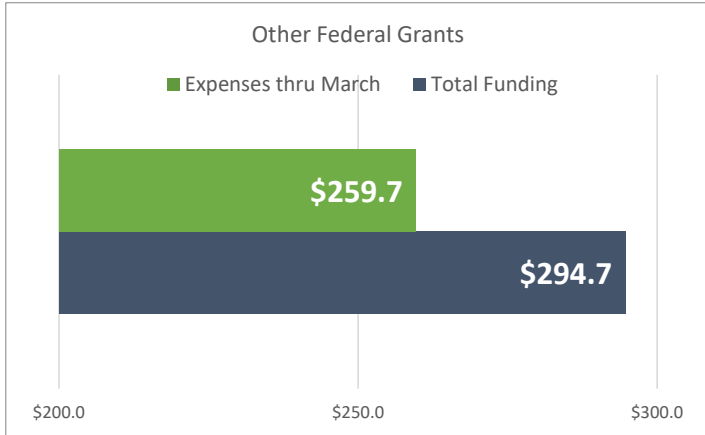

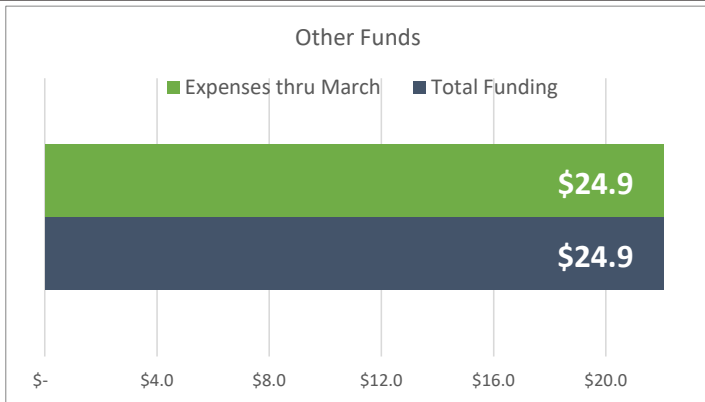
