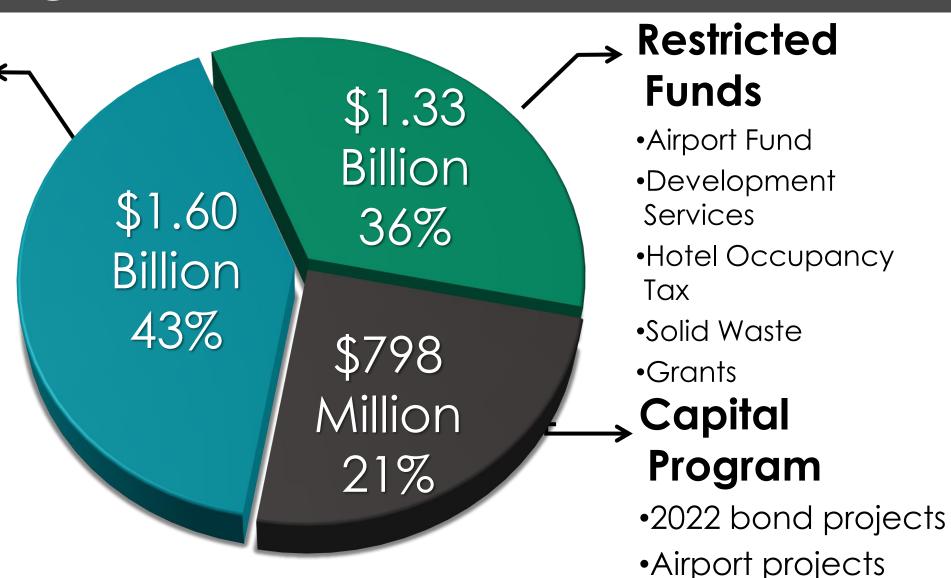


- General Fund results for first quarter are favorable

- Sales Tax revenue is flat compared to FY 2023
- Interest earnings continue to outperform budget
 - Federal Reserve outlook expected to lower interest rates

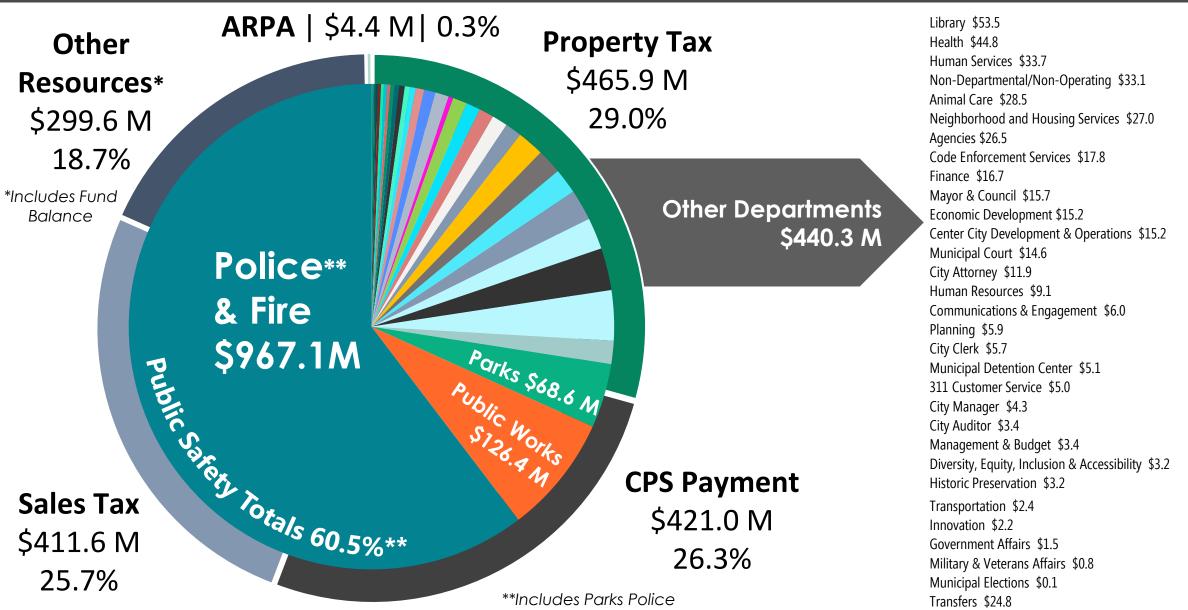
FY 2024 Adopted Budget Total City Budget \$3.7 Billion

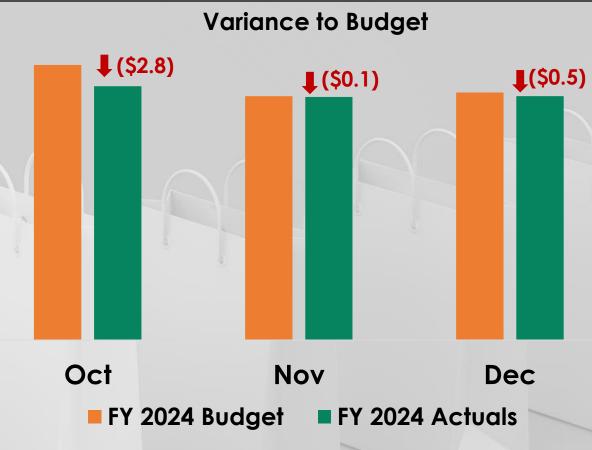

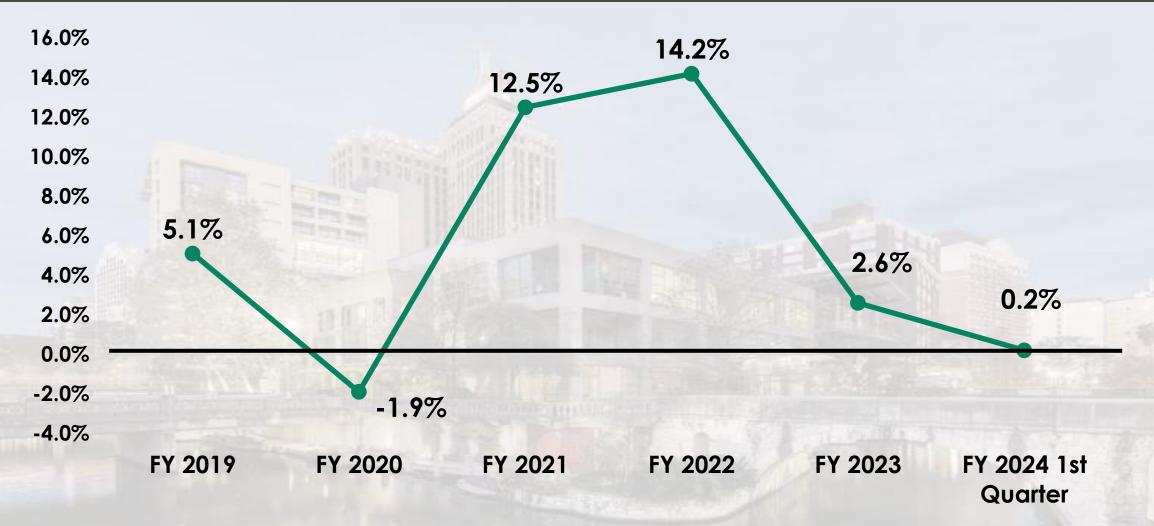

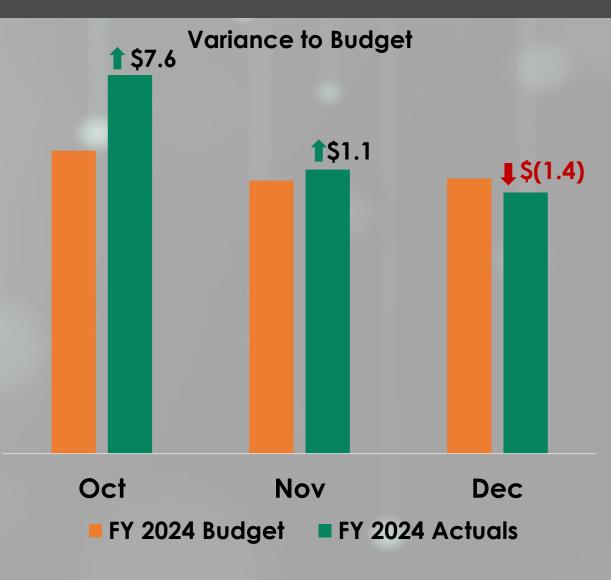

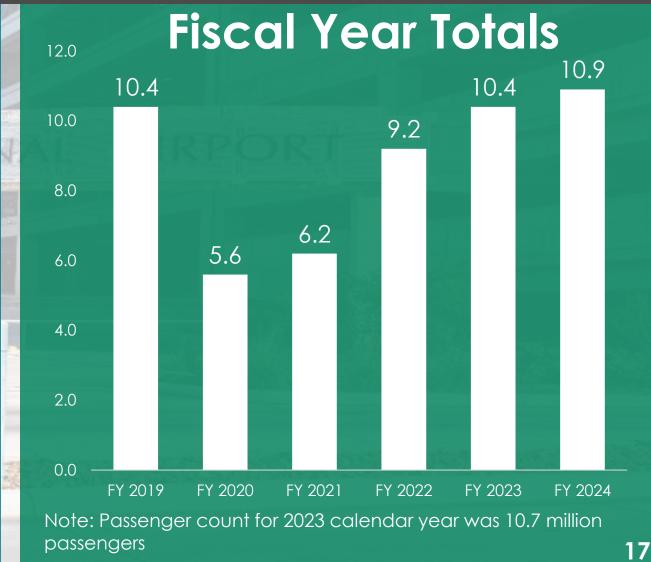

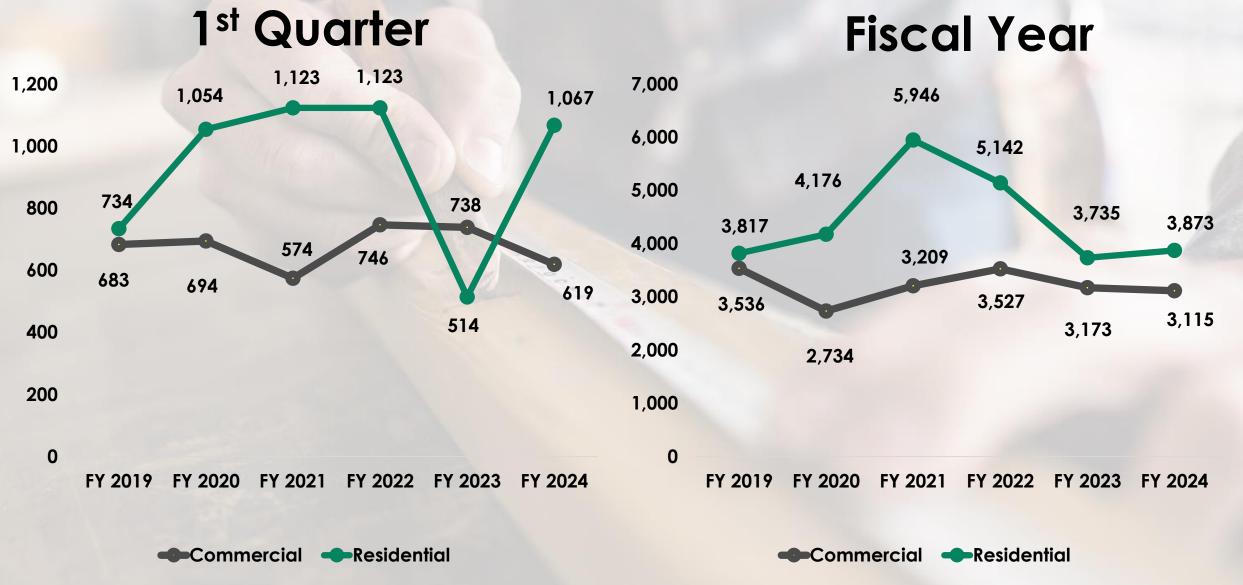

Opioid Settlement Funds

Overview of Opioid Settlement Funds

- City, County, and State of Texas all joined lawsuits against opioid manufacturers and distributors
- Settlements to date include pharmacy chains, opioid manufacturers, distributors, and more
- State of Texas has secured more than \$1.6 billion in opioid settlement funds, up to 15% of which will be passed through to local governments



COSA Settlement Funding

- COSA anticipates receiving \$6.1 Million as its share of an opioid litigation settlement, to be paid out over 18 years
 - COSA has received \$1.4M to date
 - Pending Council approval, plan is to disburse a portion in FY24
 - At this point, no future disbursements have been scheduled for this settlement
- Claims are pending against additional defendants
