Feedback Received from Businesses

Financial Need

- Surveyed businesses anticipate using grant funds for payroll, rent or mortgage, or for supplies/ inventory.
- Past recipients used grant funds for rent or mortgage, payroll, and utilities.

Program Administration

- Sense of urgency receiving funds as soon as possible is businesses' top priority.
- Need for simplicity a simple application and clear program criteria are also a top priority.

Program Criteria

- Longer and/or delayed construction projects.
- Pre-existing businesses should be prioritized.
- Consider, but not prioritize, businesses who received assistance previously.

Small Business Construction Support Grants Program

OVERVIEW OF PROPOSED PROGRAM FEB. 28 B SESSION

- \$1.4 million total funding
 - \$1.28 million direct grants
 - \$175K administrative fee
- Cash grants ranging from \$10,000 to \$35,000, based on actual reduction in net income
- Administered in partnership with LiftFund
- Prioritize pre-existing businesses that have been most financially impacted by long projects, and have not yet received City assistance

Major Council Discussion Points

Business Eligibility Criteria	 Add vape shops to list of excluded businesses Evaluate business owners' net worth – using Federal method or attestation method
Project Eligibility Criteria	 Include City-initiated construction projects that are currently under construction, and have a planned duration of at least 6 months
Scoring Criteria	 Prioritize micro-businesses via scoring criteria Standardize maximum value for all scoring criteria

Updated Criteria

Business Eligibility Criteria	 Add vape shops to list of excluded businesses Lower net revenue decrease (2023 vs. 2022) threshold from \$10,000 to \$5,000
Project Eligibility Criteria	 No changes – reducing project duration to 6 months did not result in additional projects
Scoring Criteria	 Adjust scoring distribution (20 points maximum per criterion) Maintain use of Equity Atlas-Income Only Scores as proxy for personal income to minimize administrative burden
