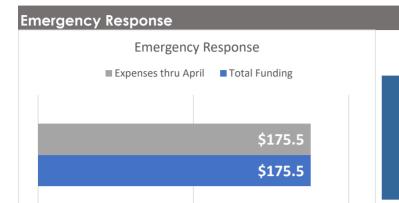
Variance Explanations

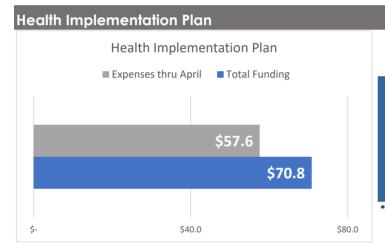
Spending Plan by Program

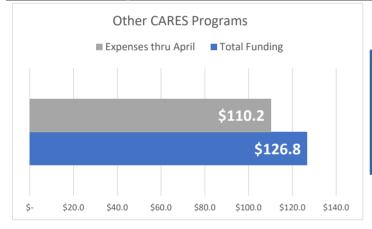

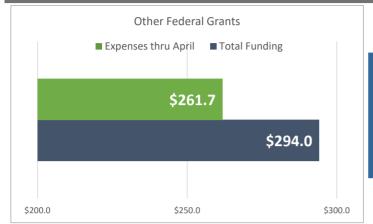

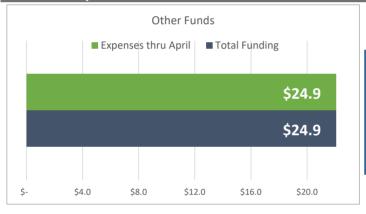
