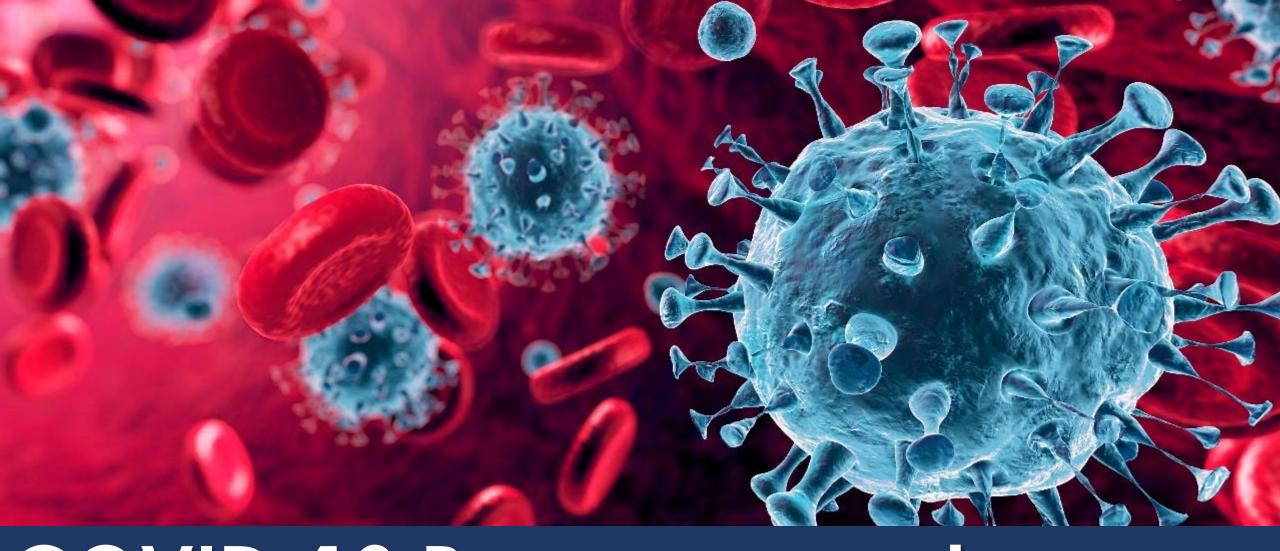

City's Financial Investment in Response COVID-19 \$1.27 Billion

\$1.11 Billion Federal Funds 87%

> \$163.5 Million Local Funds 13%

COVID-19 Response and Recovery & Resiliency Plan Background

- City began response to COVID-19 in January 2020
- Measures were taken to mitigate the spread of the virus in the community and among city employees
- In April 2020, the City Council approved the Emergency Housing Assistance Program
- In June 2020, City Council approved the Recovery and Resiliency Plan to help the community recover from the pandemic
- Today's presentation provides a financial update and recommends re-allocation of available funds

COVID-19 Response and Recovery & Resiliency Plan Financial Update

Through December 2022

- \$732.9 Million COVID Response and Recovery & Resiliency Program is funded by:
 - \$567.9 Million in Federal Grants
 - o \$165.1 Million in Local Funds
- Federal funds have been secured, except for \$17.7 Million in FEMA reimbursements:
 - \$4.8 million spent in Testing, Vaccinations, and Infusion Center
 - \$12.9 million spent in homeless hotel and isolation facility for COVID patients

American Rescue Plan Act

Background American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA)

- Signed into law in March 2021
- Intended for a strong and equitable recovery from COVID-19
- Established the State & Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (SLFRF)
 - COSA received \$326.9 Million in two tranches
 - \$163.45 Million in May 2021 & \$163.45 Million in June 2022
 - o Must be obligated by December 2024 and spent by December 2026
- Provided other funding including Airport, Housing, Health, and Child Care Services

ARPA State & Local Fiscal Recovery

\$326.9 Million

- Funds allocated through a two-phase strategy
 - Phase 1: \$97.5 Million as part of FY 2022 Budget
 - Stabilized City Budget and addressed immediate needs
 - Phase 2: \$229.4 Million allocated after robust community input process and City Council approval of spending framework in February 2022

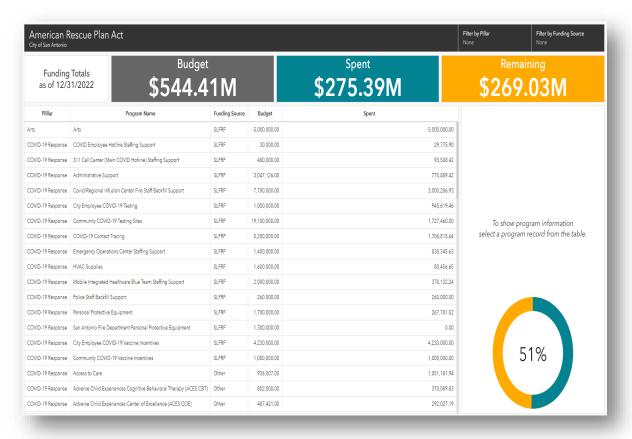

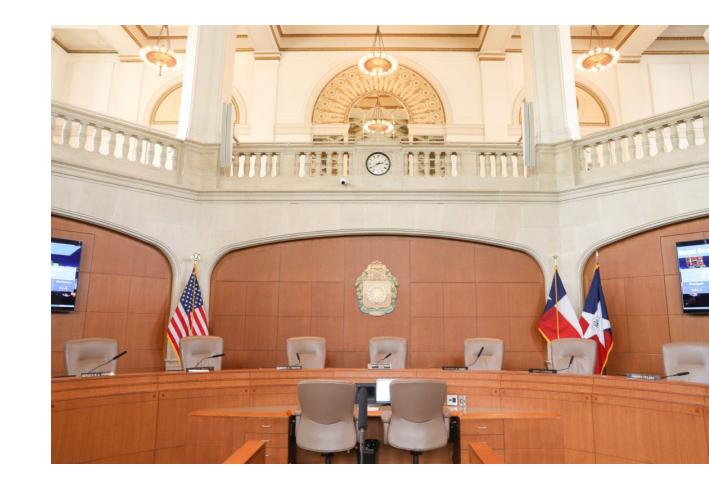
